This term in Nursery our focus will be on 'Traditional Tales'. We have started our Summer Term off with 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. The children have enjoyed listening to the story and have been completing a number of different challenges over the week. They worked hard to build a new chair for Baby Bear and have been retelling the story of the Three Bears with their friends, using props and puppets. The children have been learning how to use 'talking tins' to explore different sounds, including characters' voices and to order parts of the story. We have been exploring the outdoor area and have been using lots of resources to transport water and build on our problem solving skills in the water area and the mud kitchen. The children have enjoyed building their own assault courses and encouraging and challenging each other.



We have been so pleased with how well the children have settled back after the holidays. They are excited and full of enthusiasm for the term ahead which is so lovely to see. This week sees the start of our 'Spring and Growth' topic. We have been looking at one of our favourite stories 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and we have been learning all about the different parts of a plant. We have decided that we want to try and grow our own beanstalks so we are looking at what plants need in order to grow well. In Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of odd and even numbers and are now exploring numbers up to 20.

This week in Maths, we have been learning about counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. 5's can be quite tricky so if you could practise these at home too, that would be really helpful.

In English, we have been reading our new book, 'Handa's Surprise'. The children enjoyed learning about all the new animals and fruits that they haven't heard of before. They drew story maps to show what happened in the story.



Our topic this term is 'Kenya'. In Geography, the children labelled the seven continents and then located Kenya. In Art, we looked at pictures of 'The Big 5' and the children drew their own. I have seen some amazing rhinos, buffalos, lions, leopards and elephants. In Science, we started learning about plants and we are carrying out an experiment to see if a seed needs water to grow.

We have had a lovely week back in Year 2. It was so nice to see the whole class together again after lots of absence on the run up to Easter.

We started our week continuing our 'Mass, Capacity and Temperature' topic. We compared capacity and volume and used jugs and water to measure in ml; we recorded our answers. We began our new English unit based on the book 'How to Hide a Lion' and learned to understand the difference between exclamations, questions and statements. In Geography, we started 'What's it like to live by the Coast?' and used maps to locate the seas and oceans surrounding the United Kingdom.







The children also did some wonderful non-fiction writing this week. In role as Neil Armstrong, the children wrote diary entries reflecting on their recent, successful mission in Apollo 11 and how it feels to be the first person to set foot on the moon. The children really showed their historical knowledge on the moon landing and they were fantastic to read.

In Maths, we have continued our work on fractions, understanding the whole and comparing and ordering. We finished our work on 'The Legend of the Black Rock' and are looking forward to writing our own stories next week. In Geography, the children found out about the famous explorer Ernest Shackleton and we used 4-figure grid references to plot his final expedition to Antarctica in 1914. The class were very

excited to start our new French topic, 'Au salon de thé' and we have lots of ideas about how we can share our new language skills with the rest of the school!






Year 5 have had a fantastic start to the Summer Term!


