Taste of the Sea 2024

This week, we were visited by a resident artist, who worked on a special project with our Year 5 pupils. In the session, they looked at the 'Alauno Aura,' which sits on the promenade in Maryport. They saw that this sculpture, installed in 2008, has different images cut out to represent the history of Maryport, including Romans and Vikings. The artist taught them a range of skills for drawing with chalk and charcoal to show light, form and shade. The class produced some wonderful artwork, which has been taken away for judging. The best piece will be made into a sticker for the Taste of the Sea Festival, to be held in the town this August. Sickness

Well what a week it has been. As you are aware, we have identified that a number of children within school are off ill at the present time with symptoms of vomiting and/or diarrhoea. The numbers are larger than would normally be expected. The symptoms are suggestive of viral gastroenteritis (often caused by norovirus) and it is known that high levels of viral illness are currently circulating in the community.

If your child is affected with these symptoms we would like to reiterate to parents, carers and staff members that children should remain off school until they have been **symptom free for 48 hours**. 

Year 1

This week in Maths, we have been learning about equal and unequal amounts, grouping and making arrays. Multiplication can be tricky but their knowledge of 2's, 5's and 10's from last week has really helped them. In English, we continued reading 'Handa's Surprise'. We have been looking at capital letters and full stops and using capital letters for names and places. The children also wrote some different openers for the beginning of the story, which they are going to write next week. In topic this week, we have been exploring what the weather is like in Kenya and we found out that it is by the equator, so it is a very hot place. In Science, we made our own plants and labelled them. Some children made them with Lego, some drew them, some painted them and some children used wooden blocks. They looked fantastic. In Computing this week, the children have been making a front cover for their very own e-book, they look amazing.

Year 2

What a fun-filled week we have had in Year 2!

We started off planting sweet pea seeds for our Science topic. We are carrying out comparative tests to investigate what conditions seeds need to grow. Everyone has their own plant however three of them are being treated differently, one without water, one without warmth and one without sunlight. We are going to observe how well they grow over the next half term.

In Maths, we measured in litres and learned about temperature and how to read it using thermometers. In English, we planned and wrote a recount in the past tense, acting as the character 'Iris' who finds a lion in her back garden. The children also wrote and illustrated 'wanted posters' for the missing lion.

In Art, the children experimented with clay and practised different shaping techniques. They made a fantastic range of models such as mountains, flamingos and snails! To finish off the week, in Geography, the children located different coastlines in the UK using Google Earth and shaded them in on maps. Good work Year 2!

Year 3

This week in Year 3, we have been diving into the world of fractions. We had a blast using pizzas to grasp the concept of equivalent fractions. We also explored which fractions are equal to each other and how to work with fractions using a number line. It has been a fun and interactive learning experience!

In English, we have started reading our new class book, 'Fantastic Mr Fox' by Roald Dahl. The children enjoyed answering questions in character of Mr Fox and the farmers. We had some great farmer accents! We have made the most of the dry weather to finish our Geography topic. We mapped the school grounds and used compass points to plan our own expedition. The children enjoyed using their iPads to find the school on Google Earth and they used this to help them map the school.

In Science, we continued our new 'Light' topic and we are excited to take part in a practical light investigation next week. In RE, we had an interesting and very philosophical lesson on forgiveness - the children all shared stories about what forgiveness means to them.

In Year 4, we have started our new Science topic which is all about 'Sound'. To begin this topic, we played a 'mystery sound' game where children had to listen closely to guess what the sound was and how it was made. After this, the classroom became very lively as the children experimented with different classroom objects to understand how vibrations create sound. Hitting the drum with counters on and the ruler twang were their favourites!

In P.E the children continued to work hard on the choreography for the Wizard of Oz dance and have made good progress.

In Maths, we are continuing to look at fractions. This week our focus has been on improper fractions and mixed numbers. There was a lightbulb moment at one point when some of the children noticed patterns and how fractions are related to the times tables.


