14% of you said we didn't make you aware of what your child was learning during the year	<ul> <li>Send out our curriculum intent statement and continue to share it on the website.</li> <li>Teachers will share the topics the children will be studying and planning will be on the website</li> <li>Links to any sites or documents that can support the children's learning will be shared with parents.</li> <li>Parent meetings are planned for twice a year where teachers will share with parents the work their child is doing in more detail and the progress they are making.</li> </ul>
7.1% of you did not feel concerns were dealt with properly	<ul> <li>Encourage parents to raise their concerns straight away with the class teacher either via phone call or email.</li> <li>If still not satisfied then the concern to be raised with the Head who will respond as soon as possible.</li> <li>Meetings face to face will be arranged to resolve any issues which may remain</li> <li>School has an open door policy so parents can contact us freely when they need to.</li> </ul>
11.4% either disagreed or did not know that we make sure the children are well behaved.	We expect the highest standards of work and behaviour from all our children.

	<ul> <li>Classroom rules and school rules are shared with all children and serious incidents put in the behaviour book</li> <li>Serious behaviour incidents are reported to the Head and parents informed</li> <li>Share our behaviour expectations with parents at the beginning of the academic year and on the website so they can be referred to if required.</li> </ul>
15.7% agreed that their child had been bullied and that the bullying had been dealt with quickly 7.2% strongly agreed or disagreed	<ul> <li>take any form of bullying very seriously</li> <li>Deal with any bullying quickly, listening to the 'victim' and the 'bully' and deciding on the most suitable way to deal with the situation.</li> <li>Contact the parents of those involved.</li> <li>A nurture group will be developed to support those children who need it.</li> </ul>
24.7% either disagreed or didn't know if the school has high expectations for their child	<ul> <li>Teachers set demanding lessons and have exceptionally high expectations for the children.</li> <li>We will review the nature of our challenges and intensify where necessary.</li> <li>We will share expectations at the beginning of the year and at regular intervals via the newsletter and website.</li> <li>We continue to have global links with other schools demonstrating the highest expectations for our children both in terms of academic and personal standards</li> </ul>
