


DEARHAM PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 17th MARCH 2023

Parents' Evening for reception to Y6

My sincere apologies but due to circumstances beyond our control we have to move the dates for parents evening appointments. We had them in the diary for 22nd and 23rd March but unfortunately this date has now changed to 27th and 28th March. Each class will send out their appointments bookings next week. Please note that apart from Y4 and Y5 who will have appointments available on both days, all other classes will only have one day available.

Safeguarding

As part of our safeguarding work in school we have a lockdown practise organised for Tuesday 28th March. I have mentioned it to the children today and explained we need to practise coming in quickly from the playground and being safe in class. I would be grateful if over the next couple of weeks you could mention this to your children and reassure them it is nothing to worry about. We will be doing the same in school. We talked about having to do it if there was a dog or cow loose rather than any other scenario. The plan is the children will be on the playground and we will have three blows of the whistle to get them into school. Reception will use their class door, Year 1 and 2 will use the Y6 doors off the bottom playground and the KS2 children will come in through the sports hall. The children will be asked to sit on the floor in the rooms they go into. These are the classrooms the children will be going into:

Nursery - their own class

Reception – into the computer room

Year 1 – the top end of their classroom

Years 2 and 3 - into the Y2 classroom

Years 4 and 5 – into the dining hall

Year 6 classes – into their central space.

Attendance Letters

The RAG rated attendance letters will be sent out at the end of this term as part of our attendance procedures.

I know the letters are not liked by everyone and I can fully understand why, but we have an obligation to have your children in school, and when their attendance slips, we have to work with you to improve it. I have taken account of the fact that we had a number of scarlet fever, strep A and bugs around Christmas. The letter that comes out at the end of this term will be for this term only.

The RAG rating works alongside our class traffic light system, which we share in assembly. The rating is:

A green light means attendance is 97%+

An amber light means attendance between 94 and 96.99%

A red light means attendance of 93% and lower

To fit in with this I have RAG rated our weekly attendance on the newsletter so you can see where the classes sit.
