As we head towards Spring and new growth and new beginnings, what better time to bring back Dearham Crack. We hope you enjoy this first edition of the new style "Crack".

We have seen quite a bit of interest in history on social media recently, so we thought we would share some information on the history behind Parish Councils. Parish Councils were formed in England in the Local Government Act of 1894 to take over local oversight of civic duties in rural towns and Villages. Prior to this date, a variety of groups based around ecclesiastical

parishes had responsibility for these matters in a system of local government that originated in the feudal system of the 8th century. The 1894 Act also helped to break the power of the Church of England over the lives of non-conformists, with the transfer of all non ecclesiastical functions to elected parish councils. The effect of the 1894 Act was to transfer all non-religious functions from the church to the elected Parish Councils. The role of parish councils was not defined particularly well, so difficulties continued until the 1972 Local Government Act was passed. This, along with other legislation, forms the structure under which all parish councils operate today. We are consulted on planning applications, although we are not decision makers. We consult with other levels of Council departments about problems that are affecting the village. Parish Councils are required to hold at least four meetings each year which are open to the public, one of which must be an Annual Meeting of the full Council. Parish Councils have certain powers and responsibilities under statute including, for example, the maintenance of village halls, allotments, benches, play areas and equipment, bus shelters, some paths, and depending on the area, also grass cutting and planting. We employ a Parish Clerk and other staff to carry out these duties. We run various events throughout the year, for example Best kept garden, Christmas Lights draw, Easter Bunny hunts, Platinum Jubilee events, various children's craft days and a Winter Market. We also give grants to groups within the village each year to support their activities. Today we have 10 Councillors and 5 vacancies, The Council meet in the evening, every 4th Wednesday of the month, except for August when there is a summer break.
