Firstly, our new History topic is all about the Vikings! Our hook for this topic was to be 'awesome archaeologists' and to dig to find some Viking artefacts. The children worked in groups to find and piece together several items, including a Viking shield, coins and even a longboat!

In English, our new topic is writing to persuade someone to visit a hot country. We will be working towards creating a persuasive holiday brochure over the next few weeks. To begin this topic, the class created some art for the children to include in their brochures. We used oil pastels with blending techniques and pencil crayons to create our masterpieces. The Year 4 staff were amazed by the skills, effort, and determination the children showed when making these!

This week, Year 5 have been studying Narrative poetry. We read and analysed the poem, 'The Highway Man', and performed our own dramatic readings and plays inspired by the story. In Maths, we practised long multiplication, before applying what we had learned, in order to solve a variety of word problems. We also began our new Science topic, 'Space', where we looked at different models of our solar system from across history, from the Ancient Greek's geocentric model, and how we came to our current heliocentric view of the solar system.



We enjoyed finishing our 'Retro-futurism' topic in Art, where we developed our sketching skills, looked at how to use perspective to create dynamic and exciting drawings. We have greatly enjoyed painting our creations in a variety of vibrant colours, to contrast the darkness of space.


We have also started our new History topic, 'What does the census tell us about our local area?'. We used an extract from the census to make inferences about people from the past.
