Sporting Challenges



This week in Nursery, we have continued with our theme of Polar animals and have been reading 'The Polar Bear and the Snow Cloud', which is a lovely book all about finding new friends and being kind and thoughtful towards others. The children spent a lot of time sharing and doing nice things for their friends, which has been really lovely to see.

In Maths, we have been looking at comparisons. The children have been working hard to compare sizes of animals. We have been learning new vocabulary 'big', 'biggest', 'small' and 'smallest' as well as 'tall' and 'shortest'. They ordered the animals independently and together in pairs. The children have also been busy making Snowmen and Penguins, using lots of different 2D shapes.

In Phonics, our sound for this week has been 'g' and the children have been tried to find objects around the classroom starting with 'g'.

As part of our 'Winter' topic, we have been looking at how it may be harder for some birds and animals to find food, particularly during snowy weather. This week we decided we wanted to help birds during winter by making bird feeders so the birds in our gardens wouldn't go hungry.

In Games, we have been introduced to 'dodgeball'. We have been practising our throwing and catching skills and learning how to work as a team. We are also learning to follow rules and listen to instructions.

In Maths, we explored pairs and identified odd and even numbers. We enjoyed playing a range of games together as a class and it was lovely to see the children independently selecting games to play with their friends during exploring time.

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


This week we have been learning more fantastic vocabulary from our book 'The

Lighthouse Keepers Lunch'. The children used some super words like infuriated, furious, horrified and baffled. In Maths, we learned to add within 20 and added ones, using number bonds. We used our ten frames and counters to help us.

In Science, we continued to look at our senses, focusing on 'taste' and 'touch'. The children wore blindfolds and tasted different fruits to see if they could guess what it was; they put their hands in a feely bag to see if they could guess what the object was just by touching it.

In History, we received a letter from Steven Spielberg asking for our help to draw a picture for the front cover of his new film that was set 100 years ago at the beach. The pictures were amazing, I am sure that he'll be using one. We also wrote about the similarities and differences between the seaside now and 100 years ago. The facts the children remembered were amazing!

This week in Year 2 we came to the end of our writing unit on 'The Colour Monster'. The children wrote some beautiful narratives, where their monster changed from one emotion to another. A special mention to Joey for his creative idea in which he was the Fear Monster as he encountered a fierce werewolf in the woods... his colour monster soon turned back to its calm green state once he realised it was just a dream!

In Maths, we introduced the idea of division through sharing between equal groups. In Art, we looked at how we can use materials to create different textures and how to make all colours by mixing primary colours with paint. We had an enjoyable Science lesson, continuing our study of 'Materials'. The children made paper bridges and tested their strength through folding the paper in different ways, balancing multilink on them and recording their findings in a block graph.

Fantastic work this week Year 2!

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Year 3 have enjoyed finding out why the Roman army was so successful this week. We looked at how well organised and trained they were and found out all about their uniform. In Maths, we

looked at the links between multiplication and division and how we can use our previous knowledge to solve calculations. In English, we watched the short film 'Treasure' and used positive descriptive language to turn objects from a rubbish tip into treasure. We also had lots of fun writing riddles! At the end of the week, we completed a discussion provoking comprehension task about the history of the comic book!

In Music, we continued to learn the lyrics to famous ballads in preparation for an upcoming performance. Finally, we completed a very muddy, but very fun, everyone has a lovely upcoming weekend!

week in Year 4.In History, we have been examining why trading was important to the Vikings. To do this, we did some 'Viking trading' of our own. The children worked together in small groups to exchange their items with other groups by suggesting a 'trade'. They collected items such as foods and materials to build shelter and tools. Then, we discussed whether we thought the Vikings were 'raiders or traders', which created a great debate!

In maths this week, we have been focusing on multiplying by 10 and 100. We used some base-10 equipment to help us with this and were then able to apply our knowledge to complete some reasoning and problem-solving questions.


