
This week we have really enjoyed looking at Chinese New Year. We loved making Chinese lanterns,

It was Safer Internet Day on Tuesday and we talked about the importance of keeping safe online. We explored the story of 'Smartie the Penguin' and he gave us lots of tips on keeping safe.



This week, we have been retelling the story of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. The children used all the amazing vocabulary we have been learning in their stories. They were fantastic.

In Maths, we used our number bonds to 10 to help us add and subtract our number bonds to 20. We also practised doubling.

In Science, we looked at how we use our senses in everyday life. We watched a video about a fireman and saw how he used his five senses in his job. We also looked at different foods and decided if they were carbohydrates, protein, dairy, fruit and vegetables, fats or oils and spreads.

The children looked at different landmarks and made these in the construction area. They used the globe to find out where they are and used an atlas to see which continent they are in.

We have had a lovely week in Year 2. In English, we planned and wrote a non-fiction leaflet about the benefits of plastic, the cons of using too much plastic and how we can make more sustainable choices. They were all brilliant; the children were really proud of these as they should be! This linked well with our Science where we planned a children's party with the rule being 'no plastic'; the children explored more sustainable and eco-friendly options. In Maths we used multilink to help us divide numbers by 2. In DT, we built the strongest chairs for Baby Bear from 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' story out of recycled materials. In Art, the children made some beautiful collages out of the hand painted pieces of paper that they painted last week! We also learned all about Chinese New Year and made some wonderful masks of Chinese Dragons.





We had an exciting week in Year 3! In Maths, we divided a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. We used base 10 to develop our understanding.

In English, we continued to work from the short film 'Treasure'. We wrote super descriptions on the dump and diary entries. A highlight of this week was our History project. We made our own Roman shields and had great fun being Roman soldiers.

We hope you all liked the Kandinsky paintings that the children brought home; they worked extremely hard and were very proud of the end results. In Science, we carried out investigations to discover the hardness and absorbency of different rocks, which was so much fun and we reached some interesting results!

On Thursday, Year 3 were the proud winners of the football tournament organised by Year 6. We were so proud of the team's sportsmanship and resilience!



We have had many exciting activities this week. On Monday, we had a visitor in school who helped us learn more about food and diet. In our Geography topic, the children were investigating where our food comes from and he helped them to understand the journey our food takes to end up on our plates. The class also made some fresh bread using a range of ingredients, it turned out to be delicious!

We have had three days of P.E. this week! On Tuesday, the children practised their accuracy of long passes in their hockey lesson. Then, in cricket on Wednesday, the children played matches in their groups.

Finally, on Thursday, the children took part in a football tournament. They showed fantastic team playing and sportsmanship and secured 4th, 3rd and 2nd place. This week, Year 5 have started reading our new English book, 'Wonder', by R.J. Palacio. This has inspired all of our extended writing activities, as we have written both letters and diary entries in character, as August, the star of the book.

We completed our work on fractions and began to look at how what we have learned correlates to decimal numbers and percentages as well. In Science, we looked at satellites, their uses, and how the debris from these satellites continues to orbit the Earth, long after they have stopped working.

In History, we continued looking at the Ancient Greeks, and how they have influenced the modern world, while in R.E., we looked at what many different cultures and religions teach about life after death.

In Computing, we continued to create interactive, animated storybooks, to share with the younger pupils. We learned how to code different buttons into our books, in order to create movement, special effects and sound.




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### **Parking**
