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## Key Stage 1 News

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This week Year 1 have been completing their NFER booklets. These are assessments in English and Mathematics and help us identify next steps. They have all worked extremely hard and I am really proud of them all.

In Geography, the children have been looking at beaches in the UK and abroad, noticing what is the same and what is different. In Science, they have been finding out about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores and then sorting animals into those groups. We also learned about pets and the children made a bar chart to show the pets we have in Year 1. In the independent areas, the children watched videos on dolphins and wrote facts about them. They weighed weighed and compared objects in Maths, and said which things were heavier and lighter than others.

This week in Year 2, the children have worked incredibly hard completing their Maths and Reading assessments. We are very proud of the progress that they have made since the Autumn term.

In Science, we looked at self hygiene and how easily germs can be spread. We discussed all of the different ways to keep ourselves clean and children made their own daily routines. In History, we investigated the significance of the 1969 Moon Landing. The children came up with questions they would like to have asked Astronaut Neil Armstrong and role played with each other to come up with some answers, based on the facts they learned in the lesson.

In PSHE, we looked at parts of the body, the correct names for them and discussed appropriate contact. The children finished off the week celebrating their hard work in the Spring Disco; well deserved Year 2!

This week in Maths we have been continuing to learn about the perimeter of rectangles and rectilinear shapes. The class drew their own shapes to a given perimeter and were also able to decipher missing side lengths. We were impressed with the children's mathematical vocabulary!

On Wednesday, Year 4 spent the afternoon outdoor learning, carrying out some fieldwork in Geography. They investigated how our forest school area is used. They completed tally charts, examined the bug-hotel and made some sketches of the school grounds.

In Art, we have finished creating our abstract art pieces, inspired by rainforest animals. The children chose a rainforest animal to draw from four different perspectives. They used a viewfinder to find a section to draw and used oil pastels to bring their work alive. They looked brilliant!

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## **Upper Key Stage 2 News**

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This week, Year 5 have worked really hard in their Spring Assessments. They all gave a fantastic effort, and completed their tests to the best of their ability! In English, we have just finished our work on 'Titanium'. The class produced wonderful extended writing, retelling the plot of the shortfilm as a story.

In Science, we have continued our work on 'Life Cycles'. We looked at how amphibians reproduce, and learned a lot of very interesting facts (including that tadpoles' gills are initially on the outside of their bodies). We looked at 'metamorphosis', and how a tadpole changes from an aquatic herbivore, into a carnivore, with legs and a pair of lungs. As part of Science Week, last Friday, each member of the class researched a famous scientist or inventor. They then produced a report about their life and their importance to their field of study.
